You will see there are few fees that have not been determined for the upcoming school year.

1. Student Fees \$20 annually
2. Meals
 - a. Student Breakfast \$1.20
 - b. Student Lunch
 - i. K-5th \$1.80
 - ii. 6th-8th \$1.90
 - iii. 9th-12th \$2.00
 - c. Adult Breakfast \$1.50
 - d. Adult Lunch \$2.75
 - e. The average price for paid first lunch last year was \$1.89. Federal regulations state the standard average price should be \$2.51. Regulations require the average charged price be raised 2% + Inflation (2.81%). The total percentage raise is 4.81%. The worksheet below illustrates our minimum increase to be 9 cents.

Recommendation:

Increase all meal prices by 10 cents. Our average price charged for a lunch meal would become \$1.99 with the 10 cent increase. The district has the option to raise the price further. The federal standard average price is determined each year, it is not a static value for a number of years.

Discussion could be had on charging 5th through 8th graders the same price as the 9th -12th graders. Both groups essentially receive the same portions. If this were done our average price charged would be \$2.03.

INSURANCE

School insurance is available this year with Student Assurance Services, Inc. Envelopes with information will be available at registration.

Title IX consequences are a large concern in the paragraph to the right. Football insurance will be with the same company. The athletic fund will pay for half of the premium for any football player, grades 9-12, wishing to take this insurance coverage. The athletic fund will pay \$125.00 and the football player will pay \$125.00. Football players will have to submit a waiver form stating that they are covered with other insurance or purchase the Student Assurance Services, Inc. before the first day of practice (August 6, 2012). **THIS INSURANCE COVERS ONLY FOOTBALL!**

Recommendation: The paragraph noted in the above snapshot should be re-written to become in compliance with Title IX. The district pays a portion for all programs or no programs. I discussed this issue with Matt Carver, legal counsel for SAI.
